Opening day for the March Lime Rock applications will be 2/5/01 for NJ Chapter members and 2/6/01 for all other BMW CCA members. Opening day for the April Summit Point School will be 2/2/01. Applications have been included in this newsletter. Our complete schedule and copies of the applications will be posed on the NJ Chapter website.

The Driver School registration process will be the same as last year. We will take all properly completed, first day postmarked applications and randomly select from the pile. We fill each run group with folks of appropriate skill level. If any run group fills with first day applicants, we review the remaining first day applicants for folks that were rejected from the previous school. If we find anyone, we place them into the appropriate run group and waitlist the last person previously selected. Remember: First day, NJ Chapter applicants with PROPERLY completed applications are considered first. Enclose those selfaddressed, stamped envelopes and use regular USPS surface mail. No metered mail and no express mail or Fedex.

Our planning for the season is not yet complete, but you should expect that our Driver School format will be similar to last season. Vehicle speeds at our events continue to increase and we will be reviewing various safety aspects of our schools. We may make some changes in these areas.

Driver School Information □

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[ Note: This column was written by my brother, Fred, former President of the New Jersey Chapter of the BMWCCA, and, more importantly, former owner of the-carthat-will-not-die (TCTWND). He sends his greetings as he writes this from the passenger cabin of a 737 some 50,000' above theMidwest. Thanks Fred. ]

Hank thought it would be fun if I wrote a guest column as a pastpresident. Originally he suggested it would be entertaining if I discussed his lack of diagnostic acumen during a recent bout with TCTWND. Instead I have chosen to relate an incident that occurred to me while I was still in High School, ah youth...

I had just left Hank's apartment in Ithaca, NY bound for Saratoga. I was on a college hunting trip in my Renault 10. About the only aspect of the car that has any relevance to this tale is its light weight and four wheel 15" disc brakes. I suppose I should also mention that my girl friend was accompanying me and we had about \$20 between us.

While still in the Finger Lakes region we were heading through Cortland, a town mostly known for its State University College (SUC) and apples. I was traveling with the traffic when we entered town and the speed limit dropped from the State Highway speed of 55 to 15. Needless to say I was summarily pulled over for my out-of-

state plates. When the town policeman found out I was a teenager to boot, I was treated to the town's finest hospitality.

After informing me that I was lucky because court was in session so that I wouldn't have to be locked up awaiting trial, the officer asked me to follow him to the municipal building. I had the brains not follow him through the red light he ran. We arrived at the court house with no further incidents. The local judge was hearing two other cases that day: a convicted wife beater getting out on parole and a man accused of a murder (I wasn't that clear on the details). Then my turn came.

The judge asked me how I pleaded to going 35 in a 15 and I said guilty. After many years of thinking about this answer, I am not sure what else I could have said.... The judge responded by asking me how long it takes a car to stop from 35 mph. I replied that I didn't know but that it was different for different cars. The judge asserted that this wasn't true, to which I said that my light Renault with 15" disc brakes stopped faster than my father's Buick Electra. The judge insisted I was wrong, and he asked me if it surprised me that it took a car 300 feet to stop from 35 mph. Well, nothing the judge said would have surprised me at that point but I didn't say that, I just said no. He

Hello, Bimmerphiles, and Happy New Year! The start of the new millennium marks the twenty-seventh [!] year of New Jersey Chapter Driver Schools and the fifteenth year of Philes' Forum.

I still wish to receive copies of your inspection reports from the NJ DMV inspection. You can either mail a photocopy of your report or simply e-mail the test data. If you choose the latter, please include both the test results and the pass/fail criteria for each pollutant along with your year, model, transmission, and mileage. [Include your name, too!] If you know at what mileage your Oxygen sensor was last replaced, include that as well. Also, please indicate what, if any modifications have been made to your motor [aftermarket chip, exhaust, etc.]. The majority of the folks who have sent in test results so far have passed with no problems. One trend which may be emerging is that DMV may not be dyno testing some Bimmers with automatic transmissions. These cars may be receiving the 2500 RPM idle emissions test instead. As I have previously reported, the idle tests do not check for oxides of nitrogen [NOx], the most difficult pollutant to control under normal running conditions. Some folks have sent in results from non-Bimmers, and I welcome these results as well. Thanks to Bimmerphiles Andre Philippe, Dennis Copeland, Ed Geller, Joe Murray, Jose Ilaw, Tom Watson, Drew Zacharda, John Novak, and Trip Lee for sending in their test results this past month.

Bimmerphile Nafi Coker related an interesting story at the last membership meeting. Nafi's automatic transmission-equipped 1992 525i was repeatedly failing the dynamometer [AKA: enhanced] emissions test at State facilities for high NOx. The normal culprits for high NOx production [lean mixture, weak oxygen sensor, overadvanced ignition timing, partially plugged fuel injector, high engine coolant temperature] were eliminated, but still the NOx was high. Nafi decided to take his Bimmer to a private inspection facility, where he reports they ran the dyno test with the automatic transmission selector in 'First' instead of 'Drive'. The 525 passed with no problem!

A possible explanation for this is that the auto trans, when left in 'D', would very likely shift into second or maybe even third gear under the 15 MPH simulated road conditions imposed by the dyno. This could really 'lug' the engine [ie: relatively high load at relatively low RPM], which would tend to make NOx production skyrocket. Nafi recommends, and I concur, that if you have a Bimmer with an automatic transmission [No, I won't get into this seeming oxymoron], you should request that the inspector run the test with the transmission selector in '1' or 'L'. I am wondering if this is related to the reports I have received from 5- and 7-Series owners who report their Bimmers are not receiving the enhanced, dyno test.

Bimmerphile Bob Gibbons' 1994 E36 3-Series failed the 2500 RPM idle test for Carbon Monoxide [0.57% CO with an allowable of 0.5%], and barely squeaked by on Hydrocarbons [98 PPM HC with an allowable of 100]. High CO and HC can be indicative of a rich fuel mixture, but not

always. Sometimes there is an underlying cause of an apparent rich mixture.

I asked Bob how old his Oxygen sensor was and how old his spark plugs were. Bob thought both were original at 37000 miles. However, when he checked his plugs, he found that they were not original and the gaps were more than 0.060" [!] and that the spark plug wells on cylinders 5 & 6 were filled with oil. Bob installed a fresh set of properly-gapped plugs and cleaned out the oil in the wells. His emissions retest yielded an HC reading of 24 PPM and CO of 0.1%.

What I think was happening in Bob's motor was that the wide plug gaps were causing partial misfires, where all of the fuel [hydrocarbons] were not burned. The incomplete combustion results in excess oxygen in the exhaust, which the oxygen sensor reports to the engine management computer. The computer interprets the excess oxygen as a lean fuel mixture, and puts in more fuel to try and correct the situation. Result: rich mixture, simultaneous high CO and HC readings.

The oil-filled spark plug wells are another problem, one which Philes' Forum will address in an upcoming issue. I think I've given you enough to think about for a while!

Next month I'll have some photos indicating where to find the troublesome main and fuel pump relays on the E30 3-Series cars ['84-'91] and a redux of a trick accessory I wrote about years ago, when I was very young, and Big AI wasn't quite so big.

## Bere Dalliri Neleb

Jiri Nechleba, known to many simply as "Autosport," passed away at his home in Binghamton on Sunday, October 22, 2000. He was 69. Born in Prague in 1931, he immigrated to the United States in 1952 having fled communist controlled Czechoslovakia.

After serving in active combat during the Korean War with the US Army, he settled in the Southern Tier of NY. In 1964, he founded Auto Sport by Jiri, a car dealership he owned and operated until his retirement in 1997. More than a car dealership, his shop was a haven for car enthusiasts throughout the northeast.

His passion for automobiles transcended the commercial realm. He was a mechanic in Formula One in the late 1950's and early 1960's. In 1973, his racing team won a national championship in the IMSA professional racing series with a BMW. He was honored by BMW in 1994 for his contribution as a leading pioneer, credited with building the marque into what it is today. Locally, he had an interest in a number of racetracks supporting motorcycle, kart and car racing.

In addition to his wife Tetsuko Nechleba, Vestal, he is survived by two sons, Jiri Nechleba and daugher-in-law Janice, Dr. Jeffrey Nechleba and daughter-in-law Mary and three grandchildren, Alexandra, Jeffrey and Joseph. He is also survived by two brothers, Otto Nechleba and Stephen Heyda, and a sister, Georgianna Heyda, and their respective families.

[ This obituary originally appeared in the Genesse Valley Chapter newsletter. I repeat it here because I bought my first BMW from Jiri in 1992. Jiri found my in his lot, drooling over a beautiful green 318is. He insisted that I take it on a test drive, and sent me off without any formalities. When I returned 45 minutes later (worried about how long I had been gone with his car) Jiri scolded me for not taking enough time to enjoy the car, and sent me back out for more! The warm reception I always received from Jiri and his son Jeff convinced me that I should buy the BMW, and I haven't looked back since. Thanks Jiri.


