Random Firings

When you hear hoof-beats, think horses. Not zebras. The principle that a simple explanation is more likely than a complicated explanation to be the right explanation certainly applies to diagnosing car-related problems. A second principle worth mentioning is that you should check and double check your work.

A case in point is a small adventure that I had a couple of weeks ago. Spring Madness had taken over, and I decided I wanted a new (at least to me) motorcycle and that it had to be a Moto Guzzi. However, I had never actually ridden one, and what little remained of my rational function in the midst of Spring Madness (along with gentle urging from Sue) made me decide to go to a Moto Guzzi dealer and ride one. So Sue, Ben, and I decided to drive from New York City to the dealer near Bear Mountain. For reasons that I do not understand, Ben had the old and fairly ratty E30 325e that he shares with Walter in the City. When Ben picked up Sue and me, he said that the car had "issues." It was making a strange noise and was vibrating.

I drove the car a few blocks and knew that the vibration was in the driveline. My first thought, and a good one, was that a wheel was loose. So I asked Ben to check the tightness. He went out and shook the wheels and said that they were all tight. Okay, on to the next potential problem. Another cause of driveline vibration on a BMW is deterioration of the guibo (a rubber coupling between the transmission and the driveshaft. But Ben and I had replaced the guibo only a few months ago, so that would not be it. An aside: Why is the rubber coupling called a guibo? That I can tell you in one word (to paraphrase Tevya). Tradition.

A third, and less likely, cause of driveline vibration is a deteriorating center hanger on the driveshaft. This cannot be carefully inspected without removing the exhaust system. Ben and I had looked at it when we replaced the guibo, and it seemed okay to us (especially relative to the PITA that it is to replace). Still, it could have gone bad. So I figured that this was the problem and commenced 1) to hoping that the car would make it home before the thing completely gave way and 2) to wondering why it is that I am still trying to hold together 17-year-old cars.

We made it to the Moto Guzzi dealer in fine shape, but, five minutes earlier, they had sold the only bike I could have ridden. So no ride for me. Still, I was able to sit on the bike and decide that it was not for me. I wanted a sport-tourer, and the Guzzi was just too much of a cruiser for my taste. The dealership also sold Ducattis and Triumphs. The Ducattis were too much the sport bike, but Triumph makes a very nice sport tourer. I asked if I could ride one was told that they would prep a new one for me, taking about an hour. No problem. We went to find a sandwich, and, just as we returned and the bike was ready to ride, the heavens opened. The torrential rain made it impossible for me to ride the Triumph. Still, I liked the look and feel of the bike.


On our way back to the City, the vibration was getting progressively worse. Driving conservatively on the

Palisades Parkway, the car suddenly ceased to accelerate. It was as if the driveshaft had snapped, which is what I figured had happened. As I gently pulled onto the grass shoulder, Sue asked why a wheel was was rolling down the highway past our car. Interesting coincidence that a wheel would fall off the car just when the driveshaft snapped. Of course a loose wheel was the problem all along.

Here is how I went wrong. My son Walter had taken the snows off the car the previous week and put on the standard tires. I asked him if he had used the torque wrench (set to 75 ft-lbs), and he said he had. When I went to use the torque wrench myself, I found that is was broken in a very odd and noticeable way. Walter said he did not have any problem with it, but I went out and checked one of the wheels. The lug bolts were plenty tight. I should have checked them all. It turns out that one of the rear wheels was loose. When I asked Ben to check the tightness as we were leaving for the Guzzi dealer, he said the wheels seemed tight, but he did not use a wrench. He shook them. In retrospect, not a good way to check torque. I should have known better. In the end, one bolt fell out and three bolts snapped. At this point the hub could not transmit power to the wheel. The wheel stayed on due to the hub-centric flange until the car bounced onto the shoulder, at which point it flew off. The car made a nice soft landing in the grass with no damage. We had it towed home, and I fixed it easily.

My first instinct was right. It was a horse and not a zebra. But I did not check carefully myself, and the result was an inconvenience that could have been a serious accident. I must confess that this was not the first time I have fixed zebras when horses were the problem. The was the time I pulled the head on my Datsun 510 to fix a clogged radiator. And there was the time I changed the transaxle on my Audi Fox to replace the wheel bearing. And so it goes.

By the way, I am now the happy owner of a 2000 Triumph Trophy 1200 motorcycle. I like it better than the 1997 BMW R1100RT I drove. In fact, I like my 1978 BMW R100/7 better than the R1100RT. Now that might get some response!

Hello, Bimmerphiles! With the driving season upon us, I have some timely tips for an M50-motor cooling system upgrade.

I still wish to receive copies of your DMV emissions inspection reports. You can either mail a photocopy of your report [preferred], or simply e-mail the test data. [Include your name, too, if you want to be famous and be mentioned in Philes' Forum!] If you e-mail, please include both the test results and the pass/fail criteria for each pollutant along with your model and year, transmission type, and mileage. If you know at what mileage your oxygen sensor was last replaced, include that as well. Please indicate what, if any, modifications have been made to your motor [aftermarket chip, intake, exhaust, etc.] and your exact model number [eq: 328i, not 3-Series].

Most M50-series sixes are equipped with a 'plastic' thermostat housing. With time, heat, and thermal cycles, these housings tend to deform such that they begin seeping coolant. The housings don't usually fail catastrophically, rather they begin to seep, and you have a mysterious coolant loss. Photo #1 is of the thermostat housing on a 75,000 mile, 1993, 2.5 liter, M50 motor in a 325i. You can see the deposits left by the coolant seepage. While we had the cooling system drained to replace the water pump, we decided to upgrade the thermostat housing to an aftermarket aluminum unit.

The aluminum housing upgrade is straightforward, and should be well within the tool and skill capabilities of even a neo-technician. [Well, you might have to borrow a wrench for the fan clutch and low-range torque wrench. Heck, with the money you save doing this job yourself you can easily BUY 'em! Better yet, request that our Chapter Tool Box buy 'em!] Although the photos of our upgrade were taken with the radiator removed to facilitate photography, all you really need remove to gain access to the

mostat housing is the mechanical radiator fan. So....let's get started!

With the cooling system drained, loosen but do not remove the mechanical fan from the snout of the water pump. Do this by putting a 32 mm [1 ¼ inch] wrench on the fan clutch hex and rapping the wrench with a mallet. REMEMBER, IT IS A LEFT-HAND THREAD. Now, after unplugging the coolant level switch in the bottom of the coolant reservoir, unplugging the electric fan switch in the passenger-side radiator tank, and disconnecting the coolant bleed hose, you can remove the two plastic rivets securing

the fan shroud/coolant reservoir assembly to the radiator.

Next have an assistant unscrew the mechanical fan and remove it as you simultaneously remove the fan shroud and lay it, lower hose still attached, across the top of the motor. Congratulations, the hardest part of the job is over!

Next, remove the 4 fasteners securing the thermostat housing to the cylinder head, and remove the housing. Photo #2 shows the housing removed but the thermostat and its sealing o-ring still in place. Note that the o-ring is

positioned between the thermostat and its housing, not under the thermostat. Several bimmerphiles have reassembled things with the o-ring under the thermostat and created a leak. Now is certainly the time to replace the thermostat as a preventative maintenance measure. With the thermostat removed, carefully clean the head surface which mates with the thermostat housing.

When you install the new thermostat, note there is a small bleed hole in it. Install the bleed hole in the 12 o-

clock position.

The new housing should come with a new 'profile gasket'. See Photo #3. Ensure that the new housing is free of casting flash and other detritus of the manufacturing process. I have seen some housings which were pretty

rough. This may explain the rather wide variation in the pricing on them [\$20-\$40]. I have found the lesser expensive housings to work just fine, however, if you clean them up. If you need a profile gasket, it is part number 11 53 1 740 437 [E36 325i/328i after 05/92]. Do NOT reuse either the thermostat o-ring or the profile gasket.

Hey, we're almost done! Install the new housing, being careful to ensure that the thermostat o-ring and the profile gasket do not slip out of place. Snug the bolts finger tight, then torque the three 6 mm bolts [10 mm hex head] to 7 lb.-ft. and the 8 mm bolt [13 mm hex head] to 16 lb.-ft. Yes, use a torque wrench and do it properly. Photo #4 depicts the new housing in place, just before we reinstalled the fan and shroud. Photos #5 & #6 are shots of the new and old thermostat housings.

Next refill and bleed the cooling system as previously covered in Philes' Forum, and you are done! Now

The New Jersey Chapter hosted a record 71 drivers at the season opener autocross at Commerce Bank Ballpark in Bridgewater. Using 3 heats, each driver got 5 consecutive runs, and only 2 worker changes between heats gave improved efficiency in running the event.

The sunny weather brought out a wide variety of machines and people looking to shake off the winter doldrums. The top finishers amongst BMWs are Roger Fisher in class A, Jonathon Sasportas, Steve Weaver and Walt Baliko in class B, Stuart Kestenbaum, Pete Revenidis and Kevin Broughton in class C, Ricardo Venegas, Philip Henderson and Jeffrey Meyers in class D, Dominick Wallbank, Drew Karpinski and Elihu Savad in class E, and Jared O'Malley, David Ngo and Tom Fitzsimmons in class F.

Jared narrowly edged out David Ngo for FTD, as well as first in class.

Class X was taken by Rick Newman, followed by Steve Ashcraft and George Zimmerman. We are using SCCA Pax index multipliers in ranking results for class X this year, rather than using just the raw times of a diverse group of cars. The pax index numbers are designed to equalize the competition according to relative abilities of the cars.

A sign of the times: A Z8 parked on the grass, and NO 2002s! (sigh). It also occurred to me that a lunch wagon could really do well at our event. We had 6 Mini Coopers, most in Class D.

Our new loaner helmets were appreciated. This is another reason for anyone who hasn't tried this yet, and is reluctant to commit to a helmet: here is your chance.

The success of the event was due in no small part to all the people who pitched in to direct the flow of cars and process the paperwork. In a small paddock, it is a challenge to smoothly manage the staging of cars, and I want to thank everyone who helped. You were great! Thanks also to Pete and Mo, who arranged for transport of all the equipment.

The full results of this autocross are posted in Excel spreadsheet format on the chapter's website in the Results area.

Our next autocross will be in the same place on May 25. I hope you can come and join us then.

New Requirement for Driver Schools

You may notice that the Driver School applications in this issue now have a requirement that attendees be members of the New Jersey Chapter. In the past the only requirement was that you be a member of the BMW CCA. So, why the change? It's because of an IRS rule that not-for-profit organizations derive a minimum of 85% of their revenue from their own members. Since each chapter of the BMW CCA is an independent entity, the 85% rule is applicable on a chapter-by-chapter basis, not across the BMW CCA organization as a whole. As a result, we've had to make this change.

If you apply to other chapter's drivers schools you may or may not run into this requirement. Each chapter is addressing the "85% rule" in line with their own budgets and needs.

Instructor Training Too!

The New Jersey Chapter has a fun packed two-day event planned for Instructor Candidates and Advanced Driver students on the main track at Summit Point. There will be lots of driving time for the advanced drivers. To qualify for the event you must be signed off as a solo student at Summit Point by the NJ Chapter. This is also a great test and tune day for Club Racers. In accordance with new National Guidelines for Driver Schools a mandatory classroom session will also be held.

Old Business. Mark DeRienzo's report on NJ Chapter paraphernalia was deferred until the May meeting.


New Business:
